Reading is Thinking

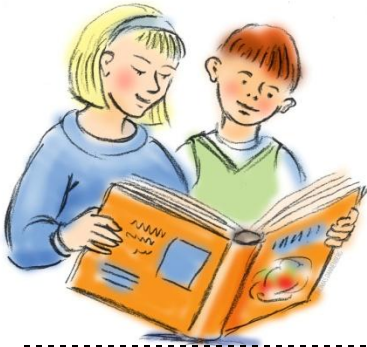
Good readers are **ALWAYS** thinking. Record at least one example per section of thinking you have done this week. *Make sure you say, "When I read the part where...it made me think...because."*
